The new program has been made possible by a five-year technical assistance grant from the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The grant will be used to provide direct technical assistance to communities across the nation on how to develop local solutions to help their communities grow in ways that benefit families and businesses while protecting the environment and preserving a sense of place.

Smart Growth America will be offering twelve “ready-to-go” technical assistance tools as part of the program, including: Implementing smart growth 101; Planning for economic and fiscal health; Sustainable land use code audit; Complete streets workshop; Using LEED-ND to accelerate the development of sustainable communities; Walkability workshop/audit; Regional planning for small communities; Smart growth zoning codes for small cities; Transportation performance measurement; “Cool planning”; Parking audits; and Implementing transit-oriented development 101.
